



# Introducing the **New Family Portal! OPEN AUGUST 5TH**

We are thrilled to announce the launch of our new Family Portal, opening AUGUST 5, 2024, where enrolled families can now easily complete their annual reauthorization applications online!

#### **Portal Access**

#### How to Access the Portal:

- Enrolled families will receive an email from our case management program, CaseWorthy, with instructions on how to access and sign
- Look for an email from the following email address:
- This portal is only open to families who are already enrolled in the subsidy program. Families on the waitlist or wishing to enroll for the first time cannot use this process at this time.

#### What to Do if You Don't Receive the Email By August 7th:

# **Eligibility Criteria**

To be eligible for the Best Starts Child Care Subsidy Program, families must meet the following criteria:

- Reside in King County
- Have a gross household income that falls below 85% • Choose a licensed child care provider of the State Median Income

  • Be ineligible for WCCC subsidy or not
- Have one or more children age 12 or

  - well served by existing programs

**Reauthorization Requirement** 



All families enrolled in our subsidy program **MUST** reauthorize to continue participation. The reauthorization application and all required materials are due no later than September 16, 2024.



The Best Starts for Kids Subsidy will cover child care up to the end of your authorization month. For most families, this period ends on **October 31, 2024**, while for other families, it extends until November 30, 2024.

#### **Income-Based Requirements for Best Starts for Kids Subsidy**

A family's household, pre-tax income must be at or below 85% SMI.





### What You'll Need to Submit

• Evidence of your residency in King County

· Washington State Driver

Credit card statement, cell phone bill, or other bill

Rent receipt

- Income Documentation
- WCCC Denial Letter if your family's income is at 60% or less of the State Median Income (SMI)

# **Documents to Prepare for Your Application**

#### Residency Documents <u>List B</u> - choose TWO documents to submit -<u>List A</u> hoose ONE OR Mortgage statement or current lease Washington State

- Any utility bill (gas, water/garbage, electricity, internet)
- · Homeowner's or renter's
- Washington State Address Confidentiality Program card (no date required) · Paystub from employer Consulate card from any
- Housing Affidavit/Attestation Statement in the application
  This will include the link to the third-party verification form of homelessness

# Income limits are for gross income, meaning pre-tax income. Gross income includes all sources of income before any deductions, such as wages, salaries, tips, unemployment benefits, child support, and any other income

#### **Income Sources**

- Employment income W-2 / 1099
- · Self-employment income, capital gains income, dividend income (from stocks), interest income, royalty income
- Disability insurance- SSI/SSDI
- Student financial aid
- TANF or other cash benefits (such as unemployment insurance)
  - Rental income
  - Received Child Support Jobs paid in cash
- Other income

## To Note:

Families are initially responsible for determining if their income falls at or below the limits listed for WCCC and Best Starts Subsidy. After the reauthorization application is submitted, our team will review the provided income documentation to make the final determination of

total gross income.
